However, care should be given to presenting a neat appearance to the judge. ALL MOUNTED RIDERS MUST wear approved ASTM/SEI helmets regardless of competition level and boots. To be held in outdoor standard size dressage arena, 20m x 60m (rain or shine). Ride times will be emailed Thursday before the show or available at [www.dreamonfarm.com](http://www.dreamonfarm.com). Management reserves the right to limit class size. It is your responsibility to familiarize yourself with the DOF show rules (back page of entry).

Shows, in principal, will follow USEF rules pertaining tack, bits, and equipment. Formal attire and braiding are not required. However, care should be given in presenting a neat appearance to the judge. ALL MOUNTED RIDERS MUST wear boots and approved ASTM/SEI helmets regardless of competition level, and age. All classes will be held in outdoor standard size dressage arena, 20m x 60m – rain or shine. Warm up will be held in outdoor arena (188' x 88') and indoor arena (210' x 60'). **Please no trainers in the warm up ring and pass left shoulder to left shoulder.** Lunging is not permitted in the warm up rings and is to be done in designated grass areas or round pen. DO NOT LUNGE NEXT TO THE COMPETITION RING. Lunging may be permitted in the indoor arena if no one is using the ring to warm up. **Stalls – no stalls are available for rental.**

Current negative Coggins within the last 12 months of show date **must** be provided to Dream on Farm (DOF) with show entry. If you choose to attend multiple DOF shows you will only need to provide a copy of your negative Coggins once. **Full payment, Coggins, and all signatures of rider, owner, and parent/guardian (for Juniors), are required with entry.** Late fee of \$10 is required for all entries sent after closing date. Entries **must** be received by closing date or there will be a late fee. Pending number of entries a wait list may be established (prior to close date) and late entries may be placed on a wait list. Returned checks will be assessed a \$30 fee

Ride times will be emailed no later than Thursday before the show or available at [www.dreamonfarm.com](http://www.dreamonfarm.com). Management reserves the right to limit class size and in the event of many entries a wait list may be established prior to close date. Classes may be split in multiple divisions (JR/YR, Adult Amateur, or Pro) pending the number of entries. Special requests for ride times are not guaranteed and may not be honored.

**JR/YR, AA or Pro division:** DOF follows the definitions established by the USEF and FEI (the organization that establishes rules for international competitions). The USEF defines a junior as "an individual who has not reached his 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current USEF competition year." In other words, if a rider was still 17 on December 1st, 2016, s/he gets to show as a junior until December 1, 2017. The FEI recognizes dressage riders aged 16-21 as "Young Riders". This age group is based on the calendar year instead of the competition year. In other words, these riders are identified as "Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21." For all practical purposes, many dressage shows (both schooling and recognized) will offer a combined Junior/Young Rider division for riders 21 years old or younger. **If a rider turns 22 in 2017, s/he can no longer show as a JR/YR.** When 18 year old riders joins the USEF, they have to declare themselves as either an amateur or a professional. Professionals are basically defined as individuals who have accepted payment for teaching, training and/or riding horses. (For further details see USEF rule book GR1306). Those who are not professionals can show in Amateur classes. If you have any questions about your status as a junior/young Rider, amateur or professional, please contact the show secretary. ***Please indicate on entry form if you are a JR/YR, AA or Pro. If you are 21 or under in 2017 you will compete as a JR/YR.***

**Scratches and Refunds:** Show Secretary should be notified immediately if you cannot attend so that people on the waiting list can be contacted. Contact [niki@dreamonfarm.com](mailto:niki@dreamonfarm.com) or 440-454-4709. Full refund less office fee if the secretary is notified before the closing date. After closing date, ½ of entry fee less office fee with a veterinarian (horse) or doctor (rider) certificate OR if ride times can be filled from waiting list. In the event of the cancellation of a show due to extraordinary circumstances, refunds will be issued and riders will be notified of cancelled show.

A horse-rider combination may enter a maximum of 3 classes (not counting equitation). A rider may bring more than one horse and the horse may be ridden by more than one person, but there will be a maximum of 4 rides per horse at Introductory and Training Level. At First Level and above, a horse may compete in a maximum of three classes. No horse may be ridden twice in the same class with the EXCEPTION of the Academy Division. **High Point:** One high point ribbon will be awarded for the high point rider in Intro Level, one high point ribbon will be awarded for Training Level and above at each show, and one high point ribbon will be awarded for Western Dressage. (Equitation & rider tests are not part of the high point awards).

**Equitation – Dressage Seat Equitation** will show at walk, trot, and canter in both directions. The rider's position, seat, and correct use and effect of aids as required by Training and First Level Dressage Tests will be judged. The movements shall be performed by the exhibitors simultaneously; however, the judge may ask for independent tests and may choose movements and exercises, as required at Training Level and First Level, to be ridden in small groups or independently (see Dressage Seat Equitation test – rules and regulations). **Walk Trot Equitation** will show at walk and trot. The rider's position, seat, and correct use and effect of aids as required by Intro Level A & B Dressage Tests will be judged. There is no cross entering of the same rider in Walk-Trot Equitation and Dressage Seat Equitation at the same show. You may compete in Walk-Trot Equitation but once a rider competes at the Dressage Seat Equitation level, at Training Level or above, or in any canter class at any organization's show, they are no longer eligible to compete in the Walk-Trot Equitation Division level.

**Academy Division** – eligible to only those riders with **limited riding experience** (JR/YR or Adult Amateur) on school horses (or horse they take lessons on no more than twice a week). They may not have shown over fences, or in any canter class at any organization's show (exception Intro C), or at training level or above. Throughout the show series they may ride on a different school horse and still be eligible for the championship show in the Academy Division. Academy Division will consist only of classes Intro A, B and C but at the championship show the test for the Academy Division will be Intro Test B. This division will only be offered at the Intro Level and riders in this class will be placed separate from the regular Intro Division open to JR/YR, Adult Amateur, or Pros. Competitors may not cross enter into the other divisions (Dressage Seat Equitation, Training Level and above) and if opt to show in Dressage Seat Equitation, Training Level or above will be placed in the regular Intro Level Division rather than the Academy Division. Once a rider competes at the Dressage Seat Equitation level or at Training Level or above, over fences, or in any canter class at any organization's show, or have scored 65% or above they are no longer eligible to compete in the Academy Division.

**Championship** (two ways to qualify): To qualify for the year-end championship show same horse/rider combination must earn two qualifying scores of 60% or higher (Intro to First Level – classical or western dressage) or 58% and higher (Second and above – classical or western dressage) at any 2017 DOF show in the same level to compete in that level at championships; OR a second option is to attend two schooling shows and volunteer 4 hours (automatically qualify for championships regardless of scores earned but you must have competed in the level at two shows during the series). A horse may qualify with two different riders. However, the riders must be showing in different divisions in the championship (exception Academy Division). Only the same horse/rider combination who qualified is eligible for the championship; you may qualify in multiple divisions with qualifying scores earned for each division. No substitution of horse or rider is permitted, with the exception of equitation divisions or Academy Division in which a horse may be substituted. Competitors will ride one test, which will be the highest level test for their division (Intro will be test C). **EXCEPTION:** The test for Academy Intro division will be Test B. **Championship scoring:** Championship awards will be based on the score earned at the championship show. *Pending the number of qualifying rides for the championship show a warm up class (regular class fee) prior to your championship ride may be offered – to be determined after August show.*

**Volunteers** are welcome as we could always use the help. By volunteering 4 hours you can earn \$10 DOF credit for a future show or to apply as partial championship qualifying (*option 2, under ways to qualify for championships*). You or a friend/family member can earn your volunteer hours. DOF credit dollars are only valid for DOF shows or clinics.
